










Four campuses in central Copenhagen





Structure of programmes: 3 years+2 years+3 years








Faculty of Humanities at South Campus

Requirements for inbound students to UCPH

- Required time of studies before exchange to UCPH
 - Minimum one year (60 ECTS) of university studies (BA/Undergraduate)
- Language requirements
 - Proof of English proficiency is **only** required if applying to one or more of the following subjects: English/American Language and Culture, Film & Media Studies, Information Science, Philosophy and Political Science
- Course restrictions
 - All courses at the University of Copenhagen can be applied for, however acceptance depends on fulfilling the academic prerequisites. Most English taught courses at the Faculty of Humanities are offered as electives (meaning no required prerequisites)



Academic Calendar

Autumn semester: September – January

Spring semester: February – June

ECTS-credit based educational system

30 ECTS credits per semester

- Min. requirement for international exchange students 22.5 ECTS credits per semester.
- Max. requirement for international exchange students 35 ECTS credits per semester (excl. the pre-semester course)



Courses designed for exchange students

- Pre-semester course (August and January) 'History of Copenhagen with Danish Language
- Danish Culture Courses (semester courses) a range of different courses with topics related to Denmark and Scandinavia
- Academic English Courses (semester courses)
- + a broad variety of academic courses by field of study offered in English

Normal credit load per semester course: 7,5 ECTS or 15 ECTS

Exams

Exam Periods

Winter exams: December – January

Summer exams: May-June

Type of Exams

Depends on the individual course



Offers for international exchange students

- Housing
 - All exchange students are given an offer of accommodation by the University of Copenhagen Housing Foundation

Orientation days

Two days of introduction to international students with a strong focus on social and cultural integration

Buddy Programme

The Humanities International Student Society:

Peer to peer run society with focus on mentoring international exchange students

The Student Society of Copenhagen 'Studenterhuset'

Placed centrally in old Copenhagen all students and especially internationals will find daily activities and mentor programmes available for them.
