(5) Tuition Fee: Based on the agreement

a: Exempted if covered by the agreement

b: If not exempted, a fee of JPY 461,000 per semester will be billed after the application deadline has passed.

(6) **Dormitory**

- ★Since Tokai University's Exchange Program operates under academic exchange agreement, participating students are required to reside in the university-designated dormitory. This policy ensures effective enrollment management, student safety, and comprehensive support throughout their campus life. We kindly ask that you acknowledge and accept this condition before submitting your application.
- ★Beginning with the Spring Semester of 2026, exchange students will be accommodated in a newly established dormitory. For further details, please refer to the website below: https://dormy-ac.com/page/tokai/tokai-university-hills/gallery/
- < Dormitory Fee > (Estimated)
- a. The fee will be exempted if covered by the exchange agreement.
- b: If not exempted, a monthly fee of JPY 80,000-90,000 per month will be billed after arrival in Japan)
- *Kindly be advised that this dormitory is managed by an external company and is not affiliated with the university.
- *Exchange students will be accommodated exclusively in "Single Room Type ①."
- *The above fee includes utilities and internet service. Please note that the listed amounts are estimates and may differ slightly from the actual billed amount.

(7) Part-time Work Restrictions:

As a general rule, exchange students are expected to dedicate themselves fully to their studies during their stay in Japan, and therefore, engaging in part-time employment is not permitted.

[STEP 1] Open call announcement

Tokai University will distribute the application guidelines to our partner universities by email. We kindly request that the designated coordinators review the document for detailed information.

< Spring 2026 admission >: End of September 2025

< Fall 2026 admission >: End of February 2026

[STEP 2] Send the nominee's information to tokai-exchange@tokai.ac.jp

We kindly ask partner university coordinators to submit the nominee's information to <u>tokai-exchange@tokai.ac.jp.</u>

Please include the following deails: Full name in English, gender, date of birth, study period, and email address.

[STEP 3] Online application to be completed by the student

Students are required to complete and submit the online application form within the designated application period.

* The application link will be sent to the home university. Students should obtain the link from their coordinator and ensure submission by the specified deadline. Please note that the form cannot be saved during the process, so all required documents should be prepared in advance.

< Spring 2026 admission >: November 1 – November 30, 2025

< Fall 2026 admission >: April 1 – April 30, 2026

★Application Documents

- 1. Personal Identification Documents
 - Recent ID photo (JPG, under 50KB, taken within 3 months, not previously used for COE)

 - Copy of passport: Must be valid through the end of the exchange period. Please renew your passport if it will expire earlier.



- Copy of the page showing the "Landing Permission" stamp and the most recent entry/exit record: Required only if you have previously obtained a Certificate of Eligibility (COE).
- Documents certifying the purpose of stay: Such as an internship certificate, graduation certificate, or transcript including attendance records. Required only for individuals who have previously stayed in Japan for more than three months.
- 2. Certificate of Japanese Language Proficiency

Required depending on the program. Please refer to Section [4] Application Requirements.

- Proof of Financial Support showing how expenses will be covered during your stay in Japan
 e.g. Scholarship certificate (if applicable)
- 4. Health condition and request for reasonable accommodations (if applicable)
- 5. Pledge form
- 6. Certificate of non-tuberculosis (<u>if applicable</u>)

[STEP 3] The Letter of Acceptance will be sent as follows:

- < Spring 2026 admission > : Sent in 2025 December
- < Fall 2026 admission > : Sent in 2026 June

(STEP 4) Application for Certificate of Eligibility (COE)

Tokai University will submit the COE application on behalf of the student.

- $\ensuremath{\mathbb{X}}$ Students who hold a Japanese passport are not eligible to apply for a COE.
- < Spring 2026 admission > : Application will be submitted in 2025 December
- < Fall 2026 admission > : Application will be submitted in 2026 June

[STEP 5] Visa Application

Tokai University will forward the Certificate of Eligibility (COE) and related documentation to the coordinator at each partner university. Students are required to apply for their visas individually.



- < Spring 2026 admission > : Documents will be forwarded in 2025 February
- < Fall 2026 admission > : Documents will be forwarded in 2026 August

[4] Application Requirements

(1) Intensive Japanese Language Program

- 1. Applicants must be currently enrolled at one of Tokai University's partner institutions.
- 2. Applicants must have Japanese proficiency equivalent to JLPT N5 level or higher.
 - *Required documents (submit one of the following):
 - ①Certificate of JLPT N5 or higher



②Letter of verification confirming that the student has completed a minimum of 150 hours of Japanese language study (1 hour = 60 minutes) at an educational institution (such as a college, high school, or Japanese language school). Please note that only actual contact hours should be included. *SAMPLE

(2) Eligibility Requirements for Taking Undergraduate Courses Taught in Japanese:

- 1. Applicants must be currently enrolled at a partner institution of Tokai University.
- 2. Applicants must have Japanese language proficiency equivalent to JLPT N2 or higher.
 - * Required documents: Certificate of JLPT N2 or higher


(3) Eligibility Requirements for Taking Engineering Courses in English

(Undergraduate and Graduate Levels)

- 1. Applicants must be currently enrolled at the following universities:
 - o Technical University of Denmark
- 2. Applicants must have English language proficiency equivalent to CEFR B2 or higher.

(4) Multidisciplinary Study Abroad Program

- 1. Applicants must be currently enrolled at one of the following universities:
 - ①National Research University Higher School of Economics
 - ②Far Eastern Federal University
 - 3 Moscow State University
- 2. Applicants must have successfully passed the Multidisciplinary Study Abroad Program selection exam.
